### **Minutes of Meeting**

### Shannon Flood Risk State Agency Co-ordination Working Group

15<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 at 10.00am

#### Introduction

Maurice Buckley (Chair) welcomed attendees and outlined the agenda for the meeting which will focus on the issues raised in recent Dáil debates on the River Shannon Management Agency Bill, 2020 and Flood Prevention Policies, and the Seanad Debate on flooding.

## Minutes of Meeting of 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2020

The Minutes of the meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2020 were approved by the Group subject to a small change proposed by Waterways Ireland.

#### **Communications**

At the last meeting, the Group agreed to the re-establishment of the Sub-committee on Communications and Stakeholder Engagement.

Nominations for the Sub-committee have now been received by the OPW and it is planned to hold the first meeting in January. It was agreed that the Department of Agriculture would be invited to nominate a representative for the Sub-committee.

The Group discussed the importance of managing communications to stakeholders which should, as appropriate, clarify the possibilities and limitations of managing flood risk along the Shannon

### Dáil and Seanad Debates

A discussion took place on the recent Dáil Private Members Motions on the River Shannon Management Agency Bill, 2020 and Flood Prevention Policies, and the Seanad Debate on flooding.

- In relation to the River Shannon Management Agency Bill, 2020i the Government has decided that this Private Members Bill will be read a second time in approximately 9 months time allowing the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform time to seek to introduce his own legislation on the matter.
- The Group discussed possible options to accelerate activities under the Work Programme, Strategic Maintenance Programme and the removal of constrictions in the Callows Region.

- The Group also discussed spatial planning, land use, climate action, environmental considerations and the potential for nature based solutions to manage flood risk.
- Bord na Móna confirmed that 80% of bogs are in private ownership. Once peat
  harvesting stops and restoration is underway with rewetting of bogs, it is not expected
  that there will be any significant benefits for alleviating flood risk. The Minister asked
  that the reasons for this be explained and addressed through the Sub-committee on
  Communications.
- Irish Water informed the Group about the 'Room for the River' programme which was developed by the Dutch Government to address flood risk.
- The Minister asked the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage to report back to the Group on local authorities' obligations and how local authority budgets are being financed for their drainage maintenance activities.
- The County and City Managers Association (CCMA) will follow up on additional nominees, including a representative for the Lower Shannon area.
